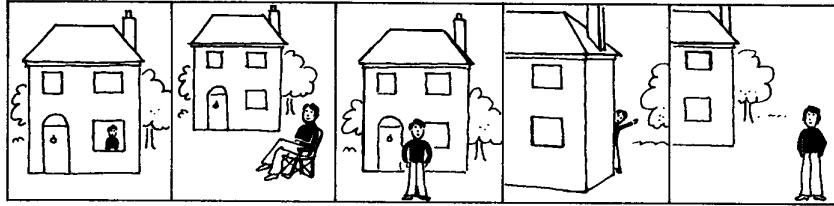
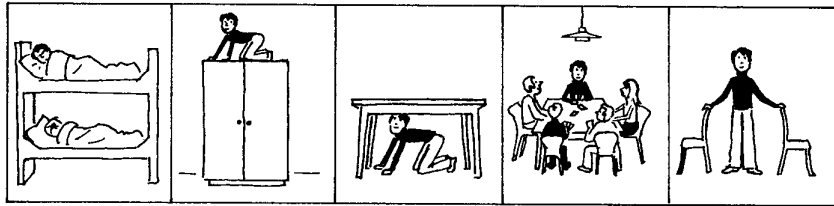

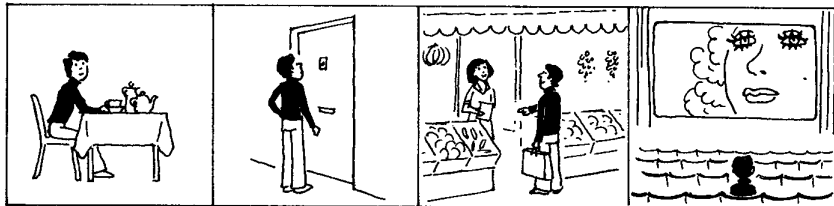
Where?



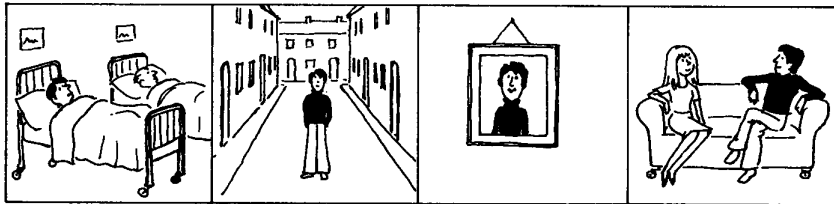
in, inside the house **outside** the house **in front of** the house **behind** the house **near, not far from** the house



above his brother **on** the wardrobe **under** the table **round** the table **between** the chairs

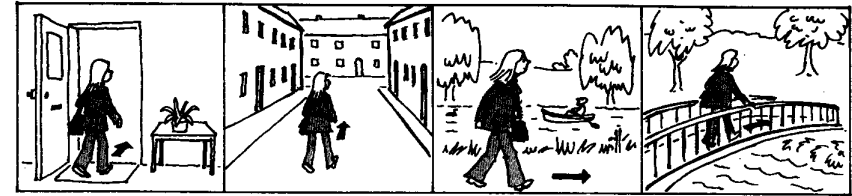


at the table **at** the door **at** the greengrocer's **at** the cinema

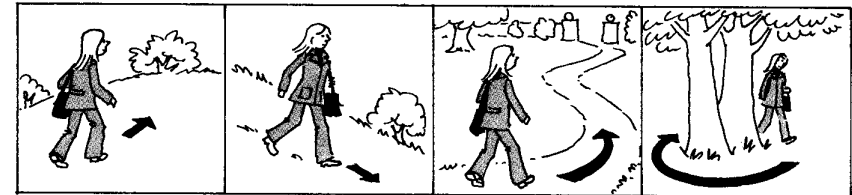


in bed (hospital) **in** the street **in** the picture **on** the wall **with** Mary

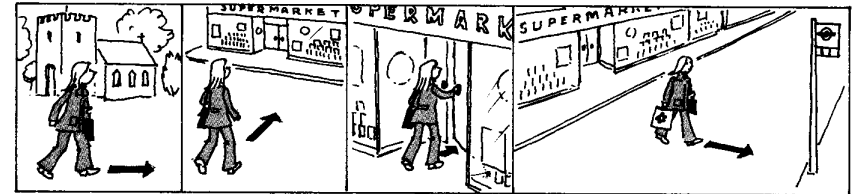
Where is Jenny going? — She is going ...
